Summer grants awarded

HILLSDALE — The Hillsdale County Community Foundation recently announced the recipients of the most recent adult grant cycle. A total of \$42,462.94 has been awarded to area non-profit organizations for projects or programs to benefit Hillsdale County residents. The following organizations were awarded funding through the Community Investment Fund:

In addition, the Community Action Agency was

Mascot will be on hand at Kids Fest


LANSING — Buy Nearby Guy, the larger-than-life mascot of Michigan Retailers Association's Buy Nearby campaign, will visit the Hillsdale Kids' Fest at 10 a.m. on Wednesday.

The 8-foot-tall figure looks like a giant, blue shopping bag in the shape of Michigan.

"Buy Nearby Guy is a big reminder of the importance of spending your shopping dollars in Michigan," said James P. Hallan, president and CEO of Michigan Retailers Association (MRA). "Keeping our money in the Mitten benefits our state and local economies and provides jobs for hundreds of thousands of Michiganders."

Buy Nearby is an ongoing, year-round, feel-good campaign intended to create excitement about the great shopping in Michigan and the advantages of making purchases from businesses that invest in Michigan. About half of every dollar spent in a Michigan store goes back into the local and Michigan economies, and more than 866,000 Michigan jobs are directly dependent on retail sales.

Even switching one in five purchases from remote sellers to Michigan locations would mean more than \$1.8 billion in increased activity and 15,000 new jobs.

"Buy Nearby Guy is excited to attend the Hillsdale Kids' Fest and pose for photos with shoppers who are buying nearby," Hallan said.

Budget finalized after pension vote

LANSING (AP) — Michigan would spend more to address debt in the teacher retirement system and to fix aging infrastructure under a budget deal that was finalized Monday, after Gov. Rick Snyder and Republican lawmakers reached a compromise to steer more newly hired school employees into

a 401(k)-only plan. The agreement, signed by state budget director Al Pscholka and the chairs of the House and Senate budget committees, cleared the way for final voting in the GOP-led Legislature to begin Tuesday before a summer recess. The next fiscal year begins in October.

After Snyder proposed his spending plan in February, Republicans pushing for

teacher retirement changes held in reserve nearly a half-billion dollars for covering transition costs to prohibit new school workers from getting a traditional pension in retirement. But not as much money is needed now that Snyder and GOP legislators have agreed to let new hires still qualify for a pension benefit if they contribute more of their pay and assume more risk.
